Patriot Platoon Leader

*You will be in charge of up to 20 personnel (Fire Control Plt HQ has 3 in addition to Plt Ldr; Fire Control Section has 12 for a total of 15; Launcher Plt HQ has 2 in addition to Plt Ldr, Launcher Section has 18 for a total of 20)
*Expect to sign for over \$40 million worth of equipment

Avenger Platoon Leader

*You will be in charge of up to 23 personnel (Each MAMD HQ Plt Ldr has 1 PSG and 2 drivers in the maneuver air and missile defense (MAMD) Plt, Sensor Section has 8 personnel per platoon, MAMD Squad has 12 per platoon for a total of 23).
*Expect to sign for over \$15 million worth of equipment

IFPC-I Platoon Leader

*You will be in charge of up to 24 personnel, (IFPC-I Plt HQ has 1 PSG and 1 driver, Intercept Control Section has 6, Sensor section has 4, C-RAM Interceptor Section has 12 for a total of 24).
*Expect to sign for over \$15 million worth of equipment

Top Gun-The Patriot Top Gun course is designed to populate Patriot/AMD units and selected AMD staffs with at least one individual with a "graduate level degree" in AMD Operations and Defense Design.

ADAFCO-This course prepares Soldiers to perform duties in existing tables of organization & equipment (TO&E) ADAFCO positions while assigned to AAMDCs and organic to ADA Brigades.

ADAM Cell Training-This training helps you learn how to provide the BCTs' staff with airspace command and control by receiving airspace coordination measures that are requested from subordinate units and forwarded through proper channels for inclusion in the airspace control order.

As a New ADA Lieutenant...

Graduating from the ADA Basic Officer Leadership Course, you will most likely be assigned to an Avenger or Patriot battery. You might also be assigned to an Indirect Fire Protection Capability—Intercept (IFPC-I) battery defending forward operating bases from indirect fire attacks.

The number of ADA personnel requirements that need to be filled across the Army and joint ADA community is growing. As the Army transforms its warfighting elements into modular Brigade Combat Teams (BCTs), ADA is embedding robust Air Defense Airspace Management (ADAM) Cells to enhance airspace management by coordinating targeting, airspace command and control, and early warning functions with ADA and aviation forces on the battlefield. ADA forces are being assigned to division, corps, and Theater level commands and task organized to subordinate commands as evolving missions dictate.

Meanwhile, ADA's presently fielded, combat-proven weapons platforms and early warning systems continue to provide the Army with a technologically advanced, fully digitized capability that enables detection and engagement of air and missile threats at greater distances with increased lethality. Fielding ADAM Cells in modular maneuver units, fielding ADA Fire Control Officer (ADAFCO) elements in Army Air and Missile Defense Commands (AAMDCs) and ADA brigades, plus embedding the Joint Tactical Ground Station (JTAGS), Forward-Based X-Band Transportable (FBX-T) Radar, and Ground-based Midcourse Defense (GMD) systems within the US Army Space and Missile Defense Command continues to complement ADA's transformation. Air Defense Artillery has lots of slots for you to fill as you advance in your career.

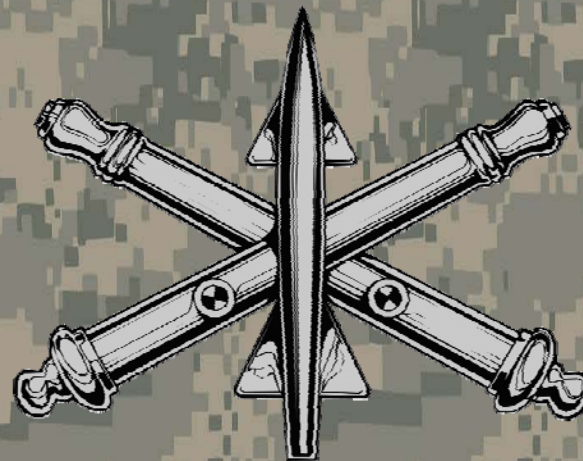

AIR DEFENSE ARTILLERY (ADA)

AMERICA'S 911 FORCE

As an Air Defender, you will defend the American homeland against long-range ballistic missiles, terrorist aerial strikes, and shield deployed U.S. forces. Theater missile defense has become a prerequisite to U.S. military intervention, since allied coalition partners demand the deployment of U.S. Air Defense Artillery forces to protect their citizens and infrastructure from retaliatory missile strikes before allowing other U.S. forces to use their country's airfields, airspace, or debarkation facilities.



AOC 14A, Air Defense Artillery Officer
General Duty Description: Responsible for the tactical employment, command and control and the airspace management of Air Defense Artillery missile and gun units. Direct technical and tactical operations, as well as the engagement techniques used by the various systems. Coordinate and provide the expertise at all levels of command and develop the doctrine and plans essential to the successful use of Air Defense Artillery weapons in support of air-land combat operations and defense against enemy aircraft and missile attacks. Develop organizational and operational concepts for future Air and Missile Defense (AMD) systems. Direct training, administration, communications, supply, maintenance, transportation and security activities of ADA units. Other opportunities include but are not limited to Senior ADA commander, liaison officer or staff officer in positions which require general air defense knowledge/experience, but are not related to a specific air defense weapons system.
